

Alice Piper Memorial Scholarship

Alice Piper, a 15-year-old Paiute student, made history in 1924 by successfully suing the Big Pine School District to integrate their classrooms and allow Indigenous students to attend their newly built school. The California Supreme Court Case, Piper v. Big Pine School District of Inyo County, not only changed the treatment of Indigenous students in California schools, but also set a precedent that was cited thirty years later in the U.S. Supreme Court case, Brown v. Board of Education of Topeka, which declared racial segregation in public schools unconstitutional. - Ellie Kaplan, National Park Service

Recipients will receive one full scholarship for a *Grantsmanship Training Program - Online* course and textbook (value \$1,255). Recipients will have 6 months from the date of the award to register and complete the class on the dates of their choice. Applicants must be working with a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization and submit:

- application
- Documentation of 501(c This)(3) status (Determination Letter from the IRS or current 990)
- Organizational budget showing revenue of \$1,000,000 or less. Budget includes revenue & expenses.

Deadline to apply for the 2024-2025 cycle is Monday, October 21, 2024.
