

Henry L. Adams Memorial Scholarship

Henry Lyle Adams (Yellow Eagle) was a Native American rights activist who was instrumental in negotiating peaceful resolutions of volatile situations between Native Americans and state and federal government officials. A successful strategist, tactician, and negotiator, Adams worked for tribal sovereignty using protests and court challenges to protect Native American rights on traditional territories. He also produced the documentary film As Long as the Rivers Run.

Recipients will receive one full scholarship for a *Grantsmanship Training Program - Online* course and textbook (value \$1,255). Recipients will have 6 months from the date of the award to register and complete the class on the dates of their choice. Applicants must be working with a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization and submit:

- This application
- Documentation of 501(c)(3) status (Determination Letter from the IRS or current 990)
- Organizational budget showing revenue of \$1,000,000 or less. Budget includes revenue & expenses.

Deadline to apply for the 2024-2025 cycle is Monday, October 21, 2024.
